Specialist Supports & Training

A great example of how our Specialist Supports and Clinical Training team adds value to everyday care can be seen in the hands-on support provided to staff working with participants who have complex medical needs.

Recently, our staff received dedicated training in stoma and nasogastric care, with this targeted learning ensuring our teams have the confidence, knowledge and clinical backing to respond to each person's individual support requirements safely and effectively.

This collaboration between frontline staff and our clinical educators is a fantastic example of how quality training leads to quality outcomes.

Safeguarding & Compliance

Our periodic NDIS audit was held in March 2026 – an important time for us to showcase the quality and safety of the supports we provide.
