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new media centre with video and podcasting technology, rolling out our new range of Meta Quest VR programs, which will see participants take on hands-on life skill programs, while also introducing our new driving simulator.

Unlimited offers unique experiences using virtual reality and interactive projectors, while also featuring calming rooms with sensory mood lighting and sensory activities.

Supported Accommodation

Progress at the DON Complex (898-900 Fifteenth Street) continues to progress, with this purpose-built space to offer a comfortable, supportive and engaging environment for short-term accommodation.

Once works are complete, SRS will be hosting an Open Day to give our community a chance to check out this great addition to our Supported Accommodation homes, which will also incorporate some of the very



latest in smart-home features. Stay tuned for more details! Meanwhile focus will soon shift to a new build at 396 Deakin Avenue, with construction of a new two-storey home to soon commence.

Being constructed in partnership with Garraway Developments, 396 Deakin is a Specialist Disability Accommodation built to the standard High Physical Support.

High Physical Support is the most advanced design category under the NDIS Specialist Disability Accommodation (SDA) framework. It provides high-level physical access and structural provisions for people with significant physical impairments who rely on power wheelchairs or ceiling hoists.

Rhythmic Squad in Robinvale

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Respite, Programs and Specialist Supports

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Other news...

Council commits to investigating Fifteenth Street Pedestrian Crossing

SRS has welcomed a Mildura Rural City Council commitment to undertake an investigation into the requirements to potentially install a pedestrian crossing on Fifteenth Street between Deakin and Walnut avenues to address safety concerns.

The commitment comes following the submission of our petition, signed by more than 250 concerned residents, to Council in June 2026 calling for the crossing's installation.

At Council's July Ordinary Council Meeting, Council agreed to:

- Review previous traffic and pedestrian data in the area
- Investigate criteria to establish a pedestrian crossing in this area
- Consult with impacted residents regarding a potential location
- Prepare a costing and timing of works report for Councillors to consider

Council has indicated it will complete these investigations over the coming months, while also meeting with us in August 2026 to discuss initial ideas for a solution.

A final recommendation is expected to be presented to Councillors at the October Ordinary Council Meeting for a final decision. We'll share more updates as they become available.

SRS completes NDIS audit with glowing review

SRS has successfully completed its latest NDIS Practice Standards recertification assessment, with the organisation recommended for continued certification across all services.

The independent assessment, conducted in March 2026 by HDAA, Australia's leading human services auditing agency, reviewed operations across service delivery, governance, participant outcomes and compliance across a broad range of supports, including Specialist Disability Accommodation (SDA), Supported Independent Living and community-based services.

The assessments found that SRS continues to meet the quality and safeguarding requirements expected of registered NDIS providers, while reinforcing its position as a trusted provider of disability support services across the region.

The assessment highlighted several organisational strengths, including a clear focus on participant choice, independence and quality of life. We also received positive feedback from our participants and staff, reflecting a supportive culture and strong reputation in the community.

Another positive highlighted by assessors was the high-quality nature of SRS' SDA homes, which were praised as "well-presented, personalised environments that reflect participants' preferences and promote independence, choice and quality of life."

As part of the NDIS quality and safeguarding framework, SRS will continue to participate in ongoing audits and monitoring activities, including a mid-term assessment before its next recertification audit.
